MY PARKING PERMIT EXPIRED YIKES!

Hallimar Properties maintains a 24/7 tow order on The Guilford Building Parking Lot to prevent violators from parking in the lot and crowding out tenants who are entitled to park there. If a tow truck driver from Kirks-Sineath Towing randomly drops by the lot to check for parking violators and sees your car with an expired permit or with no permit at all, you're toast.
